Indian Investments in Bavaria	Bavaria is keen to project itself as a preferred destination for potential Indian investments. For this, they have opened a representative office of Invest-in-Bavaria in Bengaluru in 2001 which has been upgraded to a full representative office in 2013. Their main Chambers of Commerce and Industry remain actively involved in promoting business awareness through seminars, roundtables, and sector-specific presentations. At present, approx. 100 Indian companies have invested in Bavaria and includes companies like: TCS, Wipro, L&T Infotech, Infosys Ltd, Dr. Reddy's Lab, Motherson, Aurobindo Pharma, Graphite India, etc.
Bavarian Investments in India	Bavaria-based companies have traditionally considered India as a reliable and promising economic partner. At present, approx. 350 Bavarian companies have their business ventures in India in different fields. Some of the big names include Siemens, BMW, Audi, MAN, Adidas, Allianz AG, Munich Re, Airbus, Infineon, Wacker Chemie, Osram, Linde, Krones, etc. Nearly 1,500 Bavarian companies maintain business relationships with India.
